



Indiana Right on Target

The Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Law Enforcement Division is proud to introduce the National Archery in the Schools Program. This exciting new program will be offered to Indiana schools for inclusion in the physical education or other appropriate curriculum. The program promotes student education and participation in the shooting sports. The program's focus is to provide *international target archery* training in 4-12 physical education classes.

Primary Objectives:

Engage more students in the educational process, to improve classroom performance and reduce dropout rates. The national school dropout rate is 10%. Most students (88%) who drop out of school indicate they were not involved in extra-curricular activities. Archery taught by the NASP is accessible to nearly all students. Educators are reporting that the NASP "engages the unengaged" and inspire students to greater achievement in school.

Reverse a long-term decline in hunting license sales. Declining participation in the shooting sports threatens financial and public support for wildlife conservation. NASP is designed to teach archery skills to 100,000+ students per state each year. We expect many of these young people to become shooters and shooting supporters.
