

National Archery in the Schools Program Logic Model

Archery engages students

Through archery, students develop learning skills and attitudes

Archery improves students' interest in archery and other sports

Archery improved students' attendance and performance in school

INPUTS

- Physical Education teachers
- State Fish and Wildlife partners
- NASP Curriculum
- NASP Training
- Local archery clubs and supporters

Process

- ✦ State offers NASP
- ✦ Schools sign up
- ✦ Teachers are trained by NASP
- ✦ Schools obtain equipment

OUTPUTS

- Teachers feel confident in teaching
- Archery instruction offered in physical education for one to eight weeks to students in grades 4 - 12
- After school archery clubs
- Students work with and learn from teachers & coaches

Life Skills

- ✦ Improved student motivation, behavior and confidence
- ✦ Students learn to concentrate and focus

OUTCOMES

- Students become interested in archery and other sports
- Improved attendance in physical education class
- Improved attendance in school
- Improved academic performance in physical education class and in school

EVALUATION

- ✦ Level of instructor confidence
- ✦ Level of participation of schools (length of course, after school participation, extent of whole school involvement)
- ✦ Years of implementation

- ✦ Instructor perception of training and of effects on students
- ✦ Student perceptions of archery training and effects
- ✦ Comparison of attendance, discipline, attitude and performance with non archery schools
