

Possible Funding for Your School's Archery Equipment

Your School

- Approach your School Principal with a request for funds for this program. 90% of Kentucky's NASP teachers paid for their equipment via their own school funds. When the administrators were introduced to NASP and saw how it positively influenced student attendance, behavior, self-esteem, confidence and on-task behavior, the administrators provided the funds.
- Approach your Parent Organization with a request to help you raise funds.
- Student Groups put on fund-raisers: cookie/bake sale, car washes, brat fest, and quilt raffles.
- Special needs student funds from local district.

Grants

Currently there are 67+ million grant dollars available through various physical education grants for which NASP is eligible. All school systems have grant writers who can assist you with this. The disadvantage is that the grants may take 6 months to a year to be awarded.
